MISSION

'Iolani School is a coeducational, college-preparatory school for grades K-12 founded upon Christian principles. Its mission is to develop liberally educated, well-rounded individuals who are well prepared for higher education and for responsible, moral citizenship.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Founded in 1863 at the request of King Kamehameha IV and Queen Emma, 'Iolani School has grown to become an independent, college-preparatory day school in Honolulu, Hawai'i related historically to the Episcopal Church.

- » 1,900 students, with 1,347 in grades 7-12
- » Average class size: 16
- » 197 Faculty and administrators
- » 76% of upper school faculty hold advanced degrees (12% doctorate)
- » 25 acre campus in Honolulu (population: 960,000)
- » \$4.6 million awarded in financial aid annually
- » \$52.2 million annual operating budget, \$172 million endowment
- » Highly selective admissions process
- » Vibrant performing arts program with 66% of upper school students participating each year
- » 70% of upper school students participate on at least one of 110 athletic teams
- » 99% of graduates enroll directly at four-year colleges
- » Accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges

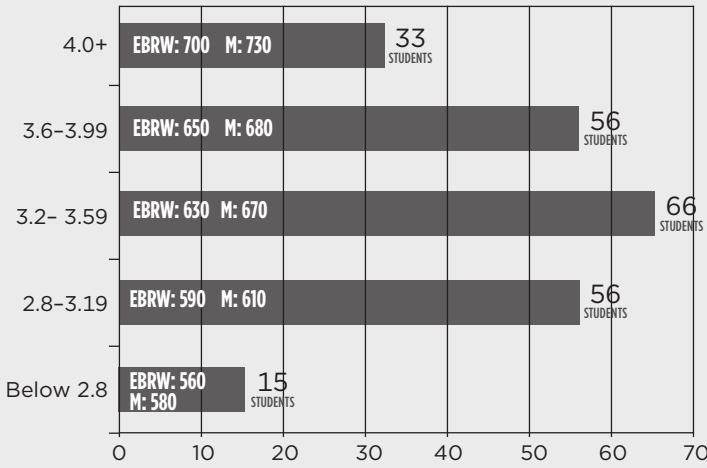

WEIGHTED GPA (six semesters) Distribution - Class of 2017 - Mean SATs for each cohort listed within the bar

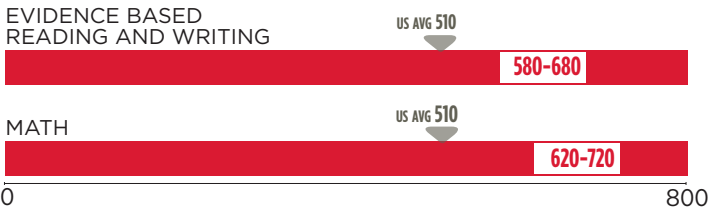


TESTING

(Middle 50% of 213 testers on the new SAT)

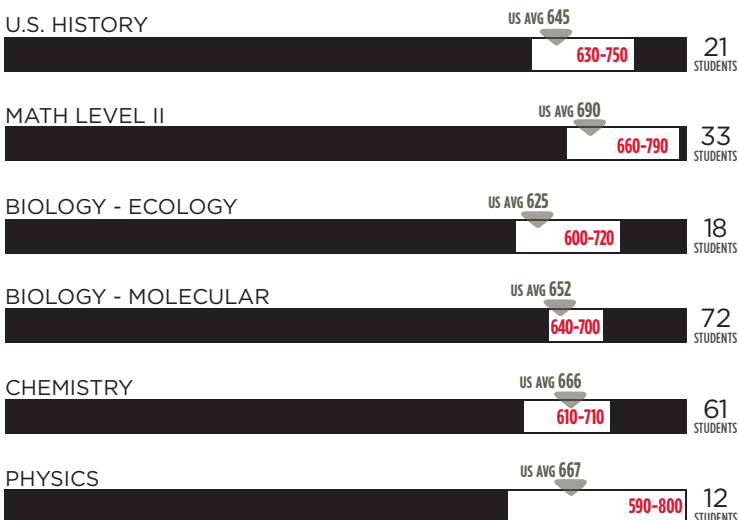


ACT (Middle 50% of 195 testers)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PERFORMANCE

In 2016, 974 AP Examinations were written, with 34% earning scores of 5, 63% earning scores of 4 or 5, and 84% receiving passing scores of 3, 4, or 5. 'Iolani students account for 7% of AP exams taken in the state of Hawaii and 19% of the 5's earned.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

12 seniors have been named National Merit Semifinalists, out of a total of 66 in the State of Hawai'i. 24 seniors have been named National Merit Commended Students.
