Entering Grades 7-12

Program Information

Upper School Summer Programs offer a wide variety of enrichment, reinforcement, and credit courses to students entering grades 7 to 12. Courses are designed to meet students' needs not only in preparation for the regular school year, but also in subjects of interest and opportunities for exploration, self-expression and creativity.

'Iolani Summer Programs welcomes 'Iolani and visiting students to experience the ONE TEAM ethos that shapes and defines our programs which foster educational excellence and personal growth in an environment that values collaboration, humility, and respect for all community members.

Before registering for classes, we kindly ask that you carefully read through this section as well as the Summer Programs Handbook with your child to learn more about our programs and their requirements.

Courses with limited enrollment eligibility are noted in the course description. You may enroll in either Session 1 OR Session 2 classes, not both as curriculum will repeat, unless otherwise noted in the course description.

Program Eligibility

- » Upper School Summer Programs are open to current 'lolani students who attended for the entirety of the 2023-2024 school year, accepted and enrolling 'lolani admissions students for the 2024-2025 school year, siblings of current 'lolani students, and visiting students
- » Eligible students should enroll in courses for the grade level they will enter in the fall 2024-2025 school year
- » Students who have been dismissed from 'lolani for disciplinary reasons may not enroll in Summer Programs unless they have been readmitted to 'lolani School and have approval by their Dean
- » Courses with limited enrollment eligibility are noted in the course description
- » Current 'Iolani students will have priority for course enrollments
- » Please see the Requirements for International Students section of the Handbook, if applicable
- » Review additional requirements listed in the handbook

Before registering, please carefully read through the "Registration FAQ" page and other important information found in the Summer Programs Handbook at summer.iolani.org.

How to Register

Registration for 'Iolani Summer Programs must be completed online via the Summer Programs Registration Portal found on the website (summer.iolani.org). No formal application is required for Summer Programs; simply register online on your assigned date and time for eligible courses.

Registrations will not be accepted by walk-in, email, telephone or fax. Registrations received prior to your child's assigned date and time, as well as incomplete registrations, will not be accepted. Registration fills quickly and program spaces are limited, so we recommend registering at the opening time.

Course Selection

Please register your child for the grade level they will be entering in the fall.

Courses with limited enrollment eligibility are noted in the course description. Current 'Iolani students will have priority for all course enrollments. You may enroll in either Session 1 OR Session 2 classes, not both, as curriculum will repeat, unless otherwise noted in the course description.

Departmental and Teacher Approval

For 'Iolani students, credit courses may require department approval. Approval requirements for other courses are indicated in the course descriptions. 'Iolani seniors, then juniors, then sophomores will be given preference in the registration of credit courses within grade range.

Waitlists

Maximum class sizes range from 12 to 18 students, and courses tend to fill quickly during registration. If your child is signed up on the waitlist, there is no guarantee of placement in the course. Waitlists are processed as space becomes available. The Summer Programs Office will notify the parent/guardian via email if the student clears the waitlist or if unable to accommodate the waitlist request up to the start of the program. Classes with exceptionally long waitlists will no longer be accessible on the Registration Portal. Please read the Handbook for additional details.

Tuition and Fees

The tuition payment in full is due at the time of online registration. You may pay by Visa, Mastercard, or American Express during online registration. Class prices are listed with the courses. Registration is not complete until paid for and submitted through the Registration Portal. Upon submission, you will receive a confirmation email.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

Students or parents who initiate course withdrawals after submitting their registration will be subject to a refund based on the date when the Summer Programs Office receives written notification from parents for the student's withdrawal. Any changes should be submitted via email to USsummer@iolani.org (gr. 7-12). Once the registration has been processed, the maximum amount of refund will be 50% of each course.

The following schedule determines the amount of the refund:

- 50% refund through Thursday, May 9
- No refunds starting Friday, May 10

There are no refunds or prorated billing for course time missed. The course fee applies regardless of how many days a child participates in the program. There will be no refunds for unused days.

Course Additions and Changes

Any requested changes, including adding classes or Meal Plan, should be submitted via email to <u>USsummer@iolani.org</u> (gr. 7-12). Please DO NOT go back into the Registration Portal to add classes as this may affect the initial selection of classes. Change requests are subject to approval.

Students or parents who initiate course changes (replacing one course for another, requesting time changes) after submitting their registration will be charged \$50.00 for each change requested. Course changes after the course begins will incur a \$100.00 charge. No course changes permitted after the first two meetings of the course.

Courses cannot be dropped or changed online. Please email USsummer@iolani.org (gr. 7-12) with your child's full name, grade and details of your change request.

Canceled Courses

Courses may be canceled due to insufficient enrollment or at the discretion of the Summer Programs Office. If this occurs, parents will be notified via email and we will assist you in finding an alternative course for your child, if space is available.

Late Registration

Registration will close on Friday, May 10 for all courses and programs. Please contact <u>USsummer@iolani.org</u> (gr. 7-12) with the student's name, grade level, and desired course if you would like to register after May 10. Online registration will not be available after that date.

If there is space in the desired course after the registration close date, a \$100.00 late fee per course will be assessed prior to course placement.

Meal Plan will not be available for purchase after Friday, May 10.

» Credit Courses & Test Prep

Lifetime Health Gr. 9

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$620

6 weeks, 2 hours, ½ credit, S/U, no final exam

Reserved for rising and newly enrolled 'lolani grade 9 students. Students in the required integrated Health and P.E. semester class will learn, develop, and practice skills that will promote and maintain one's personal health. The instructors will engage students in critical thinking skills by raising awareness through questioning, class discussion, activities, research, videos, guest speakers, and current events to explore current issues and current health trends for adolescents. Students will be provided the opportunity to use application of health and fitness knowledge and skills in making healthy personal choices, informed decisions, and advocating for the health of others. The course topics will include the priority risk content areas taken from national health standards. The physical activities will include basic movement forms and cognitive concepts needed to maintain an active lifestyle in lifetime activities. The students will also learn the components of health related fitness such as cardio endurance, muscular strength and endurance, flexibility, and body composition. Students will be able to demonstrate the ability to write their own personal fitness plan based on overload and FITT principles. This course will help students have a foundation and understanding on how to maintain their personal health throughout high school, college, and into adulthood.

Sequence 9

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$620

6 weeks, 2 hours, 1/2 credit, S/U, no final exam

Reserved for rising and newly enrolled 'Iolani grade 9 students. This semester course combines three units: Art, Media Literacy, and Community + Civic Engagement. The goal of Sequence 9 is to give students the opportunity to explore activities in these areas. Students rotate through the three units for content presentations and activities. This course fulfills the 'Iolani grade 9 Art/Media Literacy/iDept Sequence semester requirement.

Bible Gr. 11-12

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am-12:30 pm

Price: \$620

6 weeks, 2 hours, $\frac{1}{2}$ credit, graded, final exam required

Reserved for current 'lolani students. Textbooks required: please purchase at https://bnck-12.com/iolani.htm before the start of class. Students will be engaging the Bible as a primary text that represents two of the five main world religions. This will include authorship, historical context, basic theology, major characters, storylines, and various themes. The Bible and related readings will provide a basis for discussion, collaborative projects, and testing. This course fulfills the 'lolani religion requirement.

Physical Education Gr. 10-12

Time: 8:00 am - 9:00 am; 9:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 - 11:30 am;

11:30 am - 12:30 pm; 1:15 pm - 2:15 pm

Price: \$325

6 weeks, 1 hour, 1/4 credit, S/U, no final exam

Reserved for current 'Iolani students. Students will learn and participate in lifetime activities geared towards maintaining overall physical well-being. The course will follow the P.E. curriculum offered during the school year. Each student with the teacher will establish individual goals which are realistic and attainable through maximum effort. Through their participation, effort and completion of goals, students may fulfill one quarter of the P.E. requirement. Students may not enroll in more than one P.E. section. No grade level preference given. P.E. attire is acceptable during class time only.

SAT & ACT Prep Gr. 10-12

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am

Price: \$655 6 weeks, 2 hours

The 'lolani SAT & ACT prep course focuses on preparing high school students for both college entrance exams: the paper/pencil ACT and the digital SAT. This course is ideal for soon-to-be sophomores and juniors on Oahu planning to test with both exam formats or for those still deciding which to take. Students receive expert instruction on strategies and skills within the reading, writing, math, and science sections, tracking their growth with full length practice exams. The course also includes a college counseling assembly and a 2-hour review session in September before the fall testing season. There are no required textbooks for this course, but students must have a smart device to participate (Windows or Mac laptops, iPads, or school-managed chromebooks only; personal chromebooks and mobile devices will not work). Once registered, students will be asked to provide some academic information for class placement.

» Credit Courses & Test Prep

SAT Prep Gr. 10-12

Time: 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$380 3 weeks, 2 hours

The 'lolani SAT prep course focuses on preparing high school students to prepare for the new digital version of this college entrance exam. Students receive expert instruction on the evidence based reading, writing, and math sections as well as practice with the new digital format. This course is ideal for soon-to-be sophomores and juniors who have sided with the SAT as their chosen college entrance exam. Most 'lolani students elect this exam and course as they have become accustomed to the PSAT each year. The course also includes a college counseling assembly and a 2-hour review session in September before the fall testing season. There are no required textbooks for this course, but students must have a smart device to participate (Windows or Mac laptops, iPads, or school-managed chromebooks only; personal chromebooks and mobile devices will not work). Once registered, students will be asked to provide some academic information for class placement. Please enroll in session 1 OR session 2, not both.

Driver's Education

June 10 - June 21, 1:15 pm - 5:00 pm June 24 - July 5, 1:15 pm - 4:35 pm July 8 - July 19, 1:15 pm - 4:15 pm *NO CLASS on school holidays Tuesday 6/11, Wednesday 6/19, Thursday 7/4

Price: \$550

2 weeks, 30 total hours

This course will fulfill the state law for driver's education. Students must be 15½ years or older. Included are 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of individual behind the wheel instruction. Classroom instruction will take place over a two-week period. Please select only one Driver's Education class. Students must attend all class sessions to fulfill the requirements.

Behind the wheel instruction will be scheduled with the instructor outside of class time starting July 22, and is subject to instructor and student availability. Behind the wheel instruction will take place over a period of twelve weeks (drives may take longer depending on student availability and progress, and instructor availability), according to state law. *NOTE- drives are not available during school breaks and most holidays.

READ-Y Go! 7

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$595

6 weeks, 2 hours, no credit, graded

Rising and newly enrolled 7th grade 'lolani students for the 2024-25 School Year only. Textbooks required: visit https://bnck-12.com/iolani.htm to purchase before classes begin. This course focuses on developing students' skills in literary comprehension, analysis, and response, and preparing students for the important transition to Upper School. Using the summer readings for 'lolani's seventh grade English and History departments as their primary texts, the class will focus on elements of fiction, vocabulary in context, text annotation, and synthesis of the texts through a variety of learning engagements. Students will also be introduced to the executive and transitional skills to enter grade 7 at 'lolani, meet new friends, begin building their Upper School tool box, and learn all about being an Upper School Raider.

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$595

6 weeks, 2 hours, no credit, graded

Rising and newly enrolled 8th grade 'lolani students for the 2024-25 School Year only. Textbooks required: visit https://bnck-12.com/iolani.htm to purchase before classes begin. This course focuses on developing students' skills in literary comprehension, analysis, and response while covering the summer readings for 'lolani's eighth grade English and History departments as their primary texts. The class will focus on elements of fiction, vocabulary in context, and synthesis of the texts through a variety of learning engagements as well as introducing executive and transitional skills to enter grade 8 at 'lolani.

READ-Y Go! 9

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$595

6 weeks, 2 hours, no credit, graded

Rising and newly enrolled 9th grade 'lolani students for the 2024-25 School Year only. Textbooks required: visit https://bnck-12.com/iolani.htm to purchase before classes begin. This course focuses on developing students' skills in literary comprehension, analysis, and response while covering the summer readings for 'lolani's ninth grade English and History departments as their primary texts. The class will focus on elements of fiction, vocabulary in context, and synthesis of the texts through a variety of learning engagements. Students will also be introduced to the executive skills needed to transition from intermediate classes to grade 9 at 'lolani."

Short Story Essentials Grades 9-12

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am

Price: \$360 3 weeks, 2 hours

Explore the elements of style and communication in this short story writing essentials class. We will guide you through the process of planning, writing, and editing a compelling narrative. The goal is for each participant to craft a fantastic story while gaining fresh insights into the art of writing short fiction. The first half of each period will be dedicated to interactive instruction and discussion in a dynamic and supportive environment, setting the stage for the creative process, followed by space for independent writing and one-on-one consultations to offer personalized guidance and feedback to your unique writing style.

Short Story Workshop Grades 9-12

Time: 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$595 6 weeks, 2 hours

Embark on a comprehensive storytelling journey learning the fundamentals of short story writing in a workshop setting. Participants will first be guided through the process of planning, writing, and editing a short story narrative, followed by sharing their works in a writers workshop. Workshopping provides a unique opportunity for participants to read and provide constructive feedback on each other's work. This collaborative approach not only enriches the learning experience but also prepares students for the university-level methodology of advanced writing instruction. Engage in a supportive community as you refine your storytelling skills and elevate your writing style.

Writing Sense and Sensibility in Poetry and Fantasy Gr. 7-9

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$360 3 weeks, 2 hours

Students will complete a variety of assignments based on sensory experience including poetry, fantasy writing, and character sketches. With a focus on reading and language enjoyment through daily writing prompts and vocabulary exercises, we will explore the various mediums we use in expressing our literary thought. We will also hone our research and analytical skills to further develop character profiles and story lines.



Writing Your Future: Crafting Powerful Personal Statements Gr. 10-12

Time: 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$360 3 weeks, 2 hours

In this project-based class, students will begin honing the writing skills required for personal statements that can be used in college applications, resumes, cover letters, and job applications. We will focus on exploring how to tell their stories and represent themselves through their writing, building a portfolio of written work to draw from in a number of settings. Through meaningful writing projects, personal exploration and a highly reflective process, students will learn about themselves and how to convey their values and experiences in their personal statements. We will also learn basic interview skills and practice mock interviews to practically apply our self-discovery.

Write Right! Gr. 10-12

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$595

6 weeks, 2 hours, no credit, graded, no final exam

Textbooks required: visit https://bnck-12.com/iolani.htm to purchase before classes begin. Write Right! for grades 10–12 provides a comprehensive writing course focusing on literary analysis, foundational elements of academic writing, rhetorical analysis, narrative, argument, opinion and synthesis writing. There will be a focus on both individual writing and oral interpersonal communication skills, including partner and small group work.

» Innovation and Leadership

Adventures in Esports Gr. 7-12

Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am; 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Price: \$360 3 weeks, 2 hours

This class introduces students to the many careers and college opportunities in the growing field of Professional and Collegiate Esports. Students will explore topics ranging from Esports streaming and casting, team management, coaching, sponsorship, video (VOD) reviews and more as students explore the requirements, skills and desired leadership traits of college Esports team scholarships. Students may enroll in both sessions.

Al Bootcamp Grades 7-8

Auxiliary Weeks (July 22 - July 26; July 29 - August 2)

Time: 8:00 am - 2:00 pm

Price: \$650 1 week, 6 hours

Safely dive into the dynamic world of AI (artificial intelligence) in this introductory fun exploration tailored for students. In this engaging one-week course, participants will receive guided hands-on experience with the latest AI tools used in education and beyond. Topics will include asking smart questions for the instructor to send to chatGPT and learning support tools, exploring innovative art and image generation technologies. This AI Bootcamp is your gateway to understanding AI, while under the guiding safety of a supervising teacher. Whether you're just curious about AI or aspiring to becoming an early adopter to new ways of learning, this workshop is an exciting opportunity to experiment first-hand with emerging technology. Students may enroll in both Week 7 and Week 8.

Biomimicry: Sustainable Design & Innovation Gr. 7-9

Time: 10:30 am - 12:30 pm; 1:15 pm - 3:15 pm

Price: \$360

SESSION 1 ONLY, 2 hours

Life has existed on planet Earth for 3.8 billion years—that's a lot of time for nature to innovate and adapt to a huge variety of challenges. Biomimicry is the practice of looking to nature to discover solutions to the problems we face. In this workshop, you will learn how biomimicry is helping to solve some of our greatest challenges, discover the functions and strategies nature uses to solve problems, and apply the biomimicry process to a real design challenge.
